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
News from Mrs Hey

Dear Parents.







Please note: Students who missed out on their Makerspace activity in Term 2 will have the opportunity to attend during Weeks 1 & 2 next term.














Are you leaving Trinity?

If you are leaving Trinity please ensure you are aware that the Diocese requests a full terms notice, (10 school weeks) in writing, to be given to the Principal before a parent/guardian terminates a students enrolment. According to Diocesan policy, if the required notice is not given, the parent/guardian is to pay one term's school fees including diocesan fees. Upon withdrawal of a student, fees are calculated on a pro-rata basis according to the notification period given. One exception is that notice in writing, will be accepted at anytime during Term 4. This is outlined on the last page of your Term 1 school fee account statement and also on the enrolment form instructions. Please contact the school office if further clarification is required.

Wow, it's already halfway through the year! We have watched PBS4L grow and develop so much over the past few years and the students have developed a clear understanding of the Trinity expectations of being a safe, respectful learner.

This term we have had 15 students achieve their gold awards after working hard to earn 50 goannas, across 5 Mamre awards since PBS4l was implemented. It is fantastic to see our students so committed to achieving their best at school. On an even more exciting note, we've had our first DOUBLE gold award recipient this term! Sophie Hotz in Year 6 has earned 100 goannas and 10 Mamre awards since we began PBS4L in Term 4 2016. Congratulations Sophie!

Did you know we have late bus procedures to keep everyone safe in the hall each afternoon? The teachers developed 3 key procedures last year that were displayed around the hall and the students who followed these procedures could earn pawprints to go on their pawprint card in their classroom.

This term we looked at revising the bus procedures based on feedback from the students and last Thursday the late bus students in the primary grades met with Mr Bond, Mrs Holt and Mrs Pace to discuss some alternatives. We are currently trialling the 3 procedures below and when they are finalised they will be displayed in the hall as a visual reminder of the procedures. The students are continuing to earn pawprints for following these procedures.

Emmaus Catholic College



There has been a lot of construction around the College over the past 6 months and will continue throughout the year. The learning spaces are updating to coincide 21st Century teaching styles. The first of the buildings to be updated was the English Block. The space has transformed to accommodate more student collaboration. This includes multiple quiet spaces, group work areas, movable whiteboards and Televisions that allow for device connectivity.

The construction of Upper H block is nearly completed and will have more of the same flexible workspaces but will also include an outdoor area for students to work in. Once construction is finalised HSIE and Religion teachers will be the first to utilise these spaces next term. Food technology will be next, which will include brand new kitchens and alfresco area for both staff and students to enjoy.

The Year 12 Construction class are also transforming parts of the school as part of their competencies. The Principal's Lawn is turning into a passive area for students to enjoy, which will include two large outdoor chess boards. The boys worked hard despite the rain bearing down on them.
