What is the Sabbath?

The SABBATH IS A DAY THAT GOD HIMSELF SET ASIDE FOR REFLECTING, RESTING, FAMILY, FELLOWSHIP AND THANKSGIVING.

Rest is so important to God that he put it in the Ten Commandments. He wants us to take a day off every week. That's called the Sabbath, which literally means a day of rest, and God wants us to do it every seventh day. It's so important that even God rested on the seventh day when he created everything — not because he was tired but to give us an example of how we should rest.

GENESIS 2:3

"So God blessed the seventh day and made it holy, because on it God rested from all his work that he had done in creation."

At Trinity, we are taking week 7 of each term as Sabbath week. It is a time of no homework for students, except for the RED journals and teachers will have no staff meetings. This will allow the community time to re energise and refocus for the weeks ahead.

The Sabbath is a time of rest and to take time to spend with family. Especially in this time of Lent, your family may take time to Pray together, before meals or bed.

News from Emmaus

It has been a busy start to the term here at Emmaus, with the celebration of the achievements of our 2019 HSC students. Last year, Year 12 achieved the best results the school has ever received in its history. The College held the High Achievers Assembly and invited back students who worked hard to achieve their results. This included two students who received first in the state for two subjects. Emily Cheng came first in Korean Continuers, through the Open High School and Samantha Moodley who achieved first in Community and Family Studies. Samantha also achieved ATAR dux of the College, receiving 99.05. She will be studying a double degree in Arts and Commerce at Macquarie University.

With the hardships of the communities that were devastated by the bushfires over the school holidays, the College held an Australiana themed Mufti day to help raise funds to St. Vincent de Paul, to help those in need. The day began with a whole school special liturgy and video presentation, highlighting the destructive effects of these fires on people, property and fauna. We also took a moment to think of all those heroic men and women from the RFS and other Emergency Services.

Finally, the first major sporting event on the calendar, the Swimming Carnival, was held at Charlie Lowles Leisure Centre in Emerton. The College Houses, Cana, Jordan, Mamre and Tabor, were in full song, as they cheered on the competitors in the water. It was a day filled with enthusiasm and record-breaking, as Jordan toppled current house champions Tabor off the top spot. The highlight of the day however, was the entrance of the Year 12 students, who were attending their final carnival. Students dressed up as different characters and performed a Tik Tok inspired dance to the College.





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
