OSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT FOR LE



PBS4L stands for Positive Behaviour 4 Learning. At Trinity we agree to 3 PBS4L expectations:

> We are SAFE We are RESPECTFUL We are LEARNERS

The school expectations at Trinity Catholic Primary School outline appropriate student behaviours that contribute to the functioning of our school as a respectful, safe, nurturing and inclusive learning environment.

These expectations are displayed in all learning spaces and throughout the school. Students strive to follow these agreements and are given many opportunities to rehearse the skills necessary to assist them in doing so. Teachers assist the students to identify acceptable and unacceptable behaviour.

Our current Goanna Goal is: **We Follow Instructions From All Teachers** as based on our school data this is a current point of need for our students. The students engage in a PBS4L lesson when the new Goanna Goal is introduced to give them the opportunity to learn what the matrix area means and allows them the time to role play what what it looks like at school.

These Goannas are more challenging for the students to achieve as the teachers are looking for students who consistently display the Goanna Goal each day to earn them. It should take most students most of the year to earn ten Goannas to get their Mamre award.

Don't forget to check out the PBS4L shoutout board that the Year 6 house captains and vice captains are running each week. It's amazing to see what kids notice in their peers to acknowledge positive choices!
